Francois de Klerk His love for life & aviation

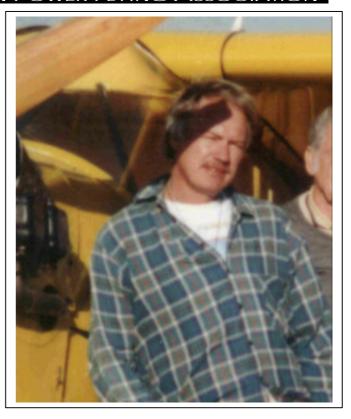
I don't remember the exact date but it must have been around 1966 or 67 when I was introduced to aviation by Francois and my dad. They had been building and flying radio-controlled models for a while now. Not so successfully, I might add. Due to the unreliability of the equipment in those days, a model aircraft didn't last very long. It either crashed or flew away. I remember chasing one of Francois's aircraft for about three kilometers that then ended up landing in a drive-in movie theater.

In 1971 Francois went of to do his military training at Airforce base Ysterplaat in Cape Town. He came back a year later, not only a man. But an expert R/C pilot. This was due to the teachings of a friend, "Dieter Rabeling" that he met in Cape Town.

Shortly after his return, Francois came home one evening with an advert out of a "SCOPE MAGAZINE". It read, "Build you own hang glider for R40: 00" and contained a line drawing of something resembling a kite with a man hanging underneath. Well, within a few days construction started. It was built out of 50mm-aluminum tubing and 4mm steel cable bracing. The covering material was a black plastic similar to the garbage disposal bags we use today. This material was stuck onto the frame using 50mm wide sticky tape. After many bumps and bruises, running up and down mine dumps, we actually got it to fly. As materials and technology improved, François again became an expert hang glider pilot. He was a many times South African champion and competed in the world championships on two occasions. He was also the first person to attain Springbok colours in hang gliding.

Francois was also instrumental in pioneering the powered hang glider, "Microlight aircraft", as we know them today. The only difference was that in those days the undercarriage was your feet. And the only reason he ran fast enough to get airborne was the fact that the prop was only about half a meter behind his arse.

In 1978 we started gliding. We bought our first glider together and did the necessary repairs to it whilst learning to fly. Francois attained second place in his very first South



African championships. He was also awarded a very prestigious trophy of the most improved pilot of the year. Over the next few years he again became a glider pilot of note. Francois was chosen to represent South Africa in the world championships in 2000. Unfortunately he was unable to partake due to work pressure. He was also elected as a team manager for the South African team but I don't remember the year. When he finally got the chance to compete in the world championships held in South Africa in 2001, his glider was damaged due to an event beyond his control, which prevented him from completing that competition.

On the 9th November 2002 Francois would attempt to break a world record. In doing so he had to load his glider with as much ballast as possible, also the weather conditions were very unstable. This is indicative of perfect gliding weather. Tragedy struck when Francois released from the tug and went into a spin. He was at low altitude and could not recover.

Francois told me once about twenty years ago that if he had a choice of how he would die, it would be doing what he loved most in life. Flying his glider.

Have a good flight "Fox one"

Thys Hermann and his team again did a sterling job with all the other aspects of marshalling. Especially since the computer didn't want to play the game.

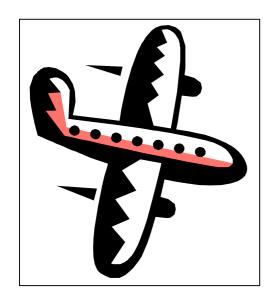
